Mathematics focuses on:

- Develop an understanding of multiplication and division strategies with single and multi-digit numbers
- Develop an understanding of fractions with numerator 1, equivalence, like and unlike denominators and extended divisors

As a school, we will...

- Invite all family members to monthly Family University nights where resources and tools will be provided to support learning at home.
- Provide the latest online resources to families: I-Ready, USA Test Prep, Prodigy, Google Classroom, ClassDojo.
- Invite and welcome all family members to the Parent Resource Suite to learn about and check out learning support games and activities.
- Encourage scholars to read 25-30 minutes nightly and provide families with exercises to help check for comprehension.



As a family, we will...

- Attend a minimum of 5 Family University Nights/engagement events to gain access to resources and tools to learning at home.
- Visit online resources at least 3-5 times per week with my scholar provided by my scholar's teacher to improve and support learning at home: I-Ready, USA Test Prep, Prodigy, Google Classroom, ClassDojo.
- Visit the Parent Resource Suite to learn about and check out learning support games and activities.
- Encourage 25-30 minutes reading per night asking questions to encourage comprehension.

As scholars, we will...

- Attend monthly academic Family University Night check-ins with my parents or family and use tools provided to help me at home with math and reading.
- Visit the online resources with my family that are designed to help me with reading and math: I-Ready, USA Test Prep, Prodigy, Google Classroom, ClassDojo.
- Use the educational resources and supports that my family checked out from the Parent Resource Suite.
- Use 25-30 minutes per night for reading and ask my parent and teacher for help with what I do not understand.
